Event Description

One member from each ASCE student chapter is to write a paper by himself or herself and deliver a presentation on the logic and reasoning of their paper. Technical paper and presentation is a national ASCE competition.

This event is **MANDATORY FOR EACH ASCE CHAPTER. Failure to participate is an AUTOMATIC DISQUALIFICATION FROM CONFERENCE.**

Objective

To prepare and present meaningful presentations on technical subjects relating to the practice of Civil Engineering.

Participate Rules

Each school may enter one team only. Each team must consist of one member only. Each team member must be a registered participant of the PSWC 2017

Technical Paper

1. Must be written by the one participant from each ASCE chapter.
2. Must be written in 12 point Times New Roman font.
3. Must not exceed 2000 words in length.
4. The topic must be the same as the 2015 National Daniel W. Mead Student Contest. The contest topic can be found at the following address: <http://www.asce.org/mead-student/>.
5. **SUBMIT BY WEDNESDAY, MARCH 1, 2017** to asce.uci.conference@gmail.com. Be sure to include the ASCE Chapter name in the subject.

Technical Presentation

1. Must deliver a 5-minute presentation with a +/- 10-second allowance. Every ten seconds the presenter goes over will result in a penalty of 1 point. At 6 minutes, the presenter will be asked to stop.
2. Five minutes are allotted to the judges to ask questions if they would like.
3. Five minutes are given to each participant to set up and to clean up.
4. A computer and a projector will be provided. Any other materials that are needed by the presenter are their responsibility.
5. Visual aids such as posters and Power Points are allowed. If you do use a Power Point, the final copy must be submitted by Friday, March 31, 2017 to asce.uci.conference@gmail.com. Be sure to include the ASCE Chapter name and "PowerPoint" in the subject of the email. You may not use a PowerPoint presentation if you do not submit one beforehand. Only the submitted copy will be used for the presentation.
6. Spectators are allowed, but are limited. They must be silent during presentations. If they are not, they will be asked to leave.

Judging

1. Five (5) judges will be scoring the event.
2. Judges will follow the scoring criteria provided in the rubric on the following page.
